## 2. Romanticize Intelligence




### "Knowledge is beautiful. Carry it like perfume."






### 4. Know That You Know Nothing

"Wisdom begins when certainty ends."






### Literature

You cannot be disgustingly educated without literature. Fiction teaches you empathy, history, and beauty, all at once.










## Philosophy & History

• World Histories (not just Europe): dive into African empires, Asian dynasties, Indigenous voices.






## LIVING THE PART

### Language & Poise

Words are your calling card. Don't just know things, know how to say them. Read poetry out loud. Practice clarity and rhythm in your speech. A disgustingly educated person doesn't need to shout; their words carry weight because they've been chosen with care.

#### Conversation as an Art

Anyone can talk. Few can converse. The trick is balance: drop references like breadcrumbs, not confetti. Ask questions as much as you answer them. People should walk away feeling they've met not just a mind, but a presence.

### **Cultural Fluency**

Know a little about many things. Art, politics, cinema, philosophy, fashion, even pop culture. The goal isn't to be an encyclopedia, it's to connect across worlds. Education without cultural fluency is sterile.




